MESSAGE FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT:

With the fall sports season in full swing, it's a great time for our community to come together in support of our athletes. For example, while we would never tolerate inappropriate comments during a musical performance, similar behavior can occasionally occur at sporting events. As a community, we share a collective enthusiasm that uplifts both our arts and athletics, contributing to a positive culture that has a significant impact on our students. As we gather to cheer them on, it is important that we all uphold the principles of good sportsmanship - whether in the stands of a stadium or the seats of an auditorium. After all, whether it's a dramatic performance or an exhilarating game, how we celebrate our students (with respect and positivity) reflects the values of our entire community.

What is Sportsmanship?

Sportsmanship is more than just following the rules of the game. It's about respect, integrity, and positivity. While we all love to see our teams succeed, it's important to remember that sportsmanship begins with us, the spectators. Our behavior sets the tone for the event and serves as a model for our young athletes, showing them how to win with grace and lose with dignity.

How Can We Be Good Spectators?

- 1. *Cheer for Everyone:* Support the effort and skill of all players, regardless of the outcome. Applauding good plays on both sides promotes a positive environment and shows respect for the hard work that every athlete puts in.
- 2. **Respect the Officials:** The referees and officials are integral to maintaining fairness in the game. They have the

- challenging job of making split-second decisions, and while we may not always agree, it's important to respect their calls and maintain a positive attitude.
- 3. Set a Good Example: Remember that students and younger children are watching. By showing respect to opposing teams, coaches, and officials, we teach valuable lessons about character that go beyond the final score.
- 4. *Stay Positive:* Win or lose, our role as spectators is to provide encouragement and support. Negative comments,

hecklings, or taunts can take the joy out of the game for everyone - players and fans alike.

FCS Alumni Give Back

Fillmore Central School Alumni Scholarship Fund Endowed with the Allegany County Area Foundation

In generous fashion, the Fillmore Central School Classes of 2020, 2022, 2023, and 2024 have endowed a scholarship with the Allegany County Area Foundation (ACAF) that will give back to future Fillmore students for generations to come. The initial donation, in the amount of \$14,964.52, was established from unused class funds that had been designated by the four classes for future use toward a class gift to the school. By pooling their resources, the classes have created an investment large enough to get the Fillmore Central School Alumni Scholarship Fund up and running.

The \$500 scholarship will be given annually to a student who:

- is a graduate of Fillmore Central School, with priority to current graduating high school seniors.
- has at least one parent, guardian, or grandparent that is an alumnus of Fillmore Central School.
- embodies the Fillmore Central School motto: Enter to learn; Go forth to serve.
- has demonstrated upstanding leadership, scholarship, and character throughout their time at Fillmore Central School.
- embraces the concept of the "Renaissance Learner," by cherishing the varied opportunities Fillmore Central School provides in both academics and extracurriculars.

The origins of this scholarship stem from a desire of members of these classes to create a gift that would make in impact on the local community. At the end of the students' senior year, it is tradition for them to take a small portion of their class fundraising efforts and donate it toward a gift for the school. Every year, the desire is to give a gift that will be not only useful to

future FCS students, but also long-lasting. Classes have donated items such as the Eagle statue in front of the auditorium, benches for spectators to enjoy the FCS facilities, and podiums for events such as graduation. Each of these items is special in their own unique way, but specialty items like these are not needed every year, and do not always withstand the test of time when wear and tear takes its toll. The hope is that by endowing a scholarship such as this, the gift can be invested in the stock market and managed by the ACAF in perpetuity, allowing this money to give back to FCS students in a meaningful way for countless years. Additionally, it could become a sort of "default" gift option for classes past, present, and future who want to give back, but are unsure of the best way to do so.

The scholarship specifically supports Fillmore graduates who have had a parent, grandparent, or guardian attend FCS. This criterion recognizes the value of young people who opt to stay local to work and raise families in the area. Western New York, and Allegany County in particular, can get a bad reputation in terms of the opportunity it affords to its young people. In reality, this area has so much to offer in terms of its natural resources, educational institutions, infrastructure, agricultural investments, and even manufacturing opportunities. As proud FCS alumni, these classes recognize the opportunities Fillmore gave them growing up. As such, they want to do their part to ensure the opportunities available to them are available to future FCS graduates. Small towns like Fillmore represent the backbone of America. This scholarship attempts to support children of family members who have continued to do their part to reaffirm the values of hard work, excellence, and development of the quintessential

Renaissance-learner that FCS has always stood for.

Many members of these classes have been the beneficiaries of ACAF scholarships throughout their years of undergraduate school. They are profoundly grateful for the donors who have invested in their future. The thousands of dollars that go out to Allegany County students each year open doors that might not otherwise be possible, and promote a society where education is valued. Whether investing in the education of a mechanic, welder, teacher, engineer, doctor, or any other valued member of society, we are reaffirming our commitment to John Locke's Social Contract by promoting the common good of society.

Members of the classes of 2020, 2022, 2023, and 2024 are thrilled that their remaining class funds are promoting such a worthy cause. As word has gotten out to other FCS alumni, they are excited for the opportunity to make their smaller donation go further by pooling resources with other alumni and having a common fund managed by the ACAF for years to come. We encourage anyone eager to join forces with these pioneering classes to help to grow this fund beyond its humble starting point. With your help, this fund could one day award scholarships of greater amounts to more than one FCS student per year.
