The National Education Association describes National Teacher Day *"as day for honoring teachers and recognizing the lasting contributions they make to our lives"*.



## HISTORY

- \*\* In 1944 political and education leaders discussed the need for a national day to honor teachers.
- \*\* In 1953, Eleanor Roosevelt persuaded the 81st Congress to proclaim a National Teacher Day.
- \*\* Congress declared March 7, 1980 as National Teacher Day.

The National Education Association continued to observe Teacher Day on the first Tuesday in March until 1985, when the National PTA established Teacher Appreciation Week as the first full week of May. The NEA Representative Assembly then voted to make the Tuesday of that week National Teacher Day. National Teacher Day is an "unofficial" National holiday.
