The FCS Music Department is THRILLED to announce that three of our student musicians have been selected to receive honors at the highest level awarded to musicians in New York State. FCS Senior Tyler Boynton, pictured right, has been accepted into the New York State School Music Association 2019 Conference All-State Mixed Chorus. Seniors, Emily Willgens (Euphonium), pictured middle, and Julia Colombo (Timpani), pictured left, have been selected as Alternates for the Symphonic Band. Tyler will travel to Rochester, New York, to rehearse with approximately 900 other All-State musicians from December 5 through December 8, 2019. He will perform in concert at Eastman Theatre on December 8 at 10:00AM. Being selected as a participant or alternate for a NYSSMA Conference All-State Ensemble represents YEARS of hard work and dedication to music. Approximately 6,000 high school music students from across the entire state apply for this honor and only 900 are selected. I am reminded of the saying that is said to have been made famous by Abraham Lincoln "You can please all of the people some of the time, but not all of the people all of time." (or something like that) Perhaps that has been the reaction to different things that FCS has been doing as we endeavor to improve school security. Actually is seems like more than most of you have adjusted well to the new procedures with the FCS greeter and registration system. Thank you to all who have patiently adjusted to this new practice.

While this was one of the suggested procedures in the recent school safety survey we are beginning to discuss another. A number of people, more than for a registration process, made comments about a School Resource Officer (SRO). While this is beginning to grow in popularity in schools, it has not been without controversy as some who occupy this position have acted in ways that are detrimental to students.

The FCS board is not yet ready to act on an SRO or similar position, but we are considering the benefits of having someone on staff whose primary role is to oversee security and act as visible presence. There are a lot of factors to consider such as: what is our level of risk, how could this person best relate with students and be a positive influence for them, would a uniformed (think police) or a plain clothes presence be better (or somewhere in between)? Additionally what overall aspects of security would be part of the position?

One thing that I believe we do not want to do is create an image that the position would be to police the students. Our goal would be more to have the person be there for the students! As you hear of other schools adding positions like this, be assured that it is a part or our conversation, and that once we move to add a position it would be designed in the way that will be the best for Fillmore Central School and your students!

Summer Driver Education Class


In conjunction with BOCES and Fillmore Central School we were able to provide Driver Education to a great group of FCS students over summer vacation. It was a wonderful experience for all involved. Objectives of this program included the teaching of driver safety, rules of the road, and the proper knowledge, attitude and skills needed to drive. In-the-car instruction provided students with the basic skills needed to drive.

I would like to thank everyone who helps to make this program successful year after year.

- This was the fourth year that the class has traveled to Marquart Farms where Jenn Frazier-Smith provided each student with a semi, tractor, special vehicle safety presentation. In her presentation Jenn provided students with the knowledge and opportunities of what it is like to sit in the seat of the big rigs. The students are able to walk around and get into the seats of these enormous vehicles to be able to see what the driver can and cannot see. She also discussed slow-moving vehicles and how to drive appropriately when you meet one of them on the road.
- Ellen Tucker came in from Walker Insurance Agency, Inc. and spoke to our Driver Education classes for the third time. She spoke to the students about the importance of driving safely, the various types of automobile insurance and special options available for safe drivers.
- Brian Perkins, Allegany DWI Coordinator, traveled to Fillmore and spoke to the class about making good choices and staying safe. He had great information and activities for the kids to participate in. It was a very eye-opening experience for all involved.
- Trooper John Campanella, School and Community Outreach Coordinator came down and spoke to our students on how to be safe on the roads and gave suggestions on how to make good decisions.

The 2019-20 school year kicked off with exciting new teacher resources, new STEM classes and the continuation of 1:1 devices for all K-12 students.

New Teacher Resources: Teachers in grades 5-12 now have access to Impero Software and teachers in grades K-4 have Apple Classroom to support digital learning on laptops and iPads. These new software applications provide teachers with instruction and monitoring tools and also provide online safety utilities to protect students while on the Internet.

Mrs. Glasner added, "I LOVE our new Impero computer program. It has made the process of using technology in our classrooms much more efficient. The students are more on task and are staying engaged with the websites or lessons they are supposed to be working on. This program has greatly improved the quality of the technology parts of our lessons."

"Apple Classroom has made teaching with the iPads in 2nd grade so much easier! It used to be so hard trying to make sure that everyone was on task and where they should be. With Apple Classroom I can check and/ or guarantee that students are working on any given task. The kids also know that I can check in, so in a way they're becoming more accountable and making sure they're making good choices as well," shared Mrs. Hatch.

Children's Health Homes of Upstate New York: is a community-based care management service model whereby all of an individual's caregivers communicate with one another so that all social, physical, and behavioral needs are met. Child/youth is under the age of 21, enrolled in Medicaid and resides in Allegany County. 2. Child/youth must meet the NYS DOH eligibility. 3. SPOA: The SPOA process involves the formation of a partnership between the parent/caregivers with the service providers working with the child and family. Emphasis is placed on working with the whole family. After assessment by the intake staff, a team SPOA meeting is scheduled for goals to be identified. The team consists of parent and involved staff from other agencies who meet to determine the strengths and needs of the child and family. Meetings will be set up to monitor progress and identify ways to sustain improvements. A crisis plan is also part of each SPOA review. Contact Lindy White at (585)593-1991.




